# 2021 Report to Croquet North from Tyneside Croquet Club from Peter Lowe

<u>Tenure</u> Promised documentation confirming that the club has a secure long term lease on its facilities has not yet been received from our landlords.

<u>Finance.</u> Commercial hire of the lawns, as last year, fell prey to Covid-19 precautions, denying again this income to the club. The pandemic also prevented lawn watering after expensive repairs in Autumn, 2020 and this, together with a drought, caused remission in the Pavilion Lawn surface that will require that the costly costly seeding and top dressing are repeated. However, membership income has marginally improved and a successful mallet road show brought in agency fees on the sale of a number of mallets.

<u>Covid-19</u>. Attendance and playing precautions were relaxed early in the season following government guidelines.

Membership The majority of members who joined at reduced fee during the previous season rejoined this April and membership now stands at one Honorary, 38 Full, one Country and two Associates. Attendance at club sessions has improved particularly among golf players where paucity of participation had been particularly disappointing. Encouraging was the extent to which newcomers to the club entered internal competitions contributing to almost all of them taking place.

Maintenance of lawns and surrounds. As described under Finance the quality of the lawns has deteriorated mainly due to circumstances beyond the control of the club. The Clock lawn has uneven grass density and some moss but the Pavilion Lawn has developed many large bare patches of uneven soil. At the beginning of October, over a dozen members responded to an appeal and worked hard for several hours cutting back the hedges and trimming the undergrowth around the lawns. Professional tining and scarification is due shortly and reseeding and top dressing of the Pavilion Lawn will be done early next Spring.

## Club Competitions and Local Leagues.

Golf. TCC competed with very limited success in the Southern Section of the CN League but did not enter teams in any national competition. Jane Pringle won the Roger Russell (this year played as a knock-out) and Peter Mattinson and May Hall the Club Doubles. The Caroline Wallace Ladies Doubles was won by Ruth Carey partnering Sheila Best in one game and May Hall in the other. Covid restrictions in early season left insufficient time for the Ivy Court Golf Handicap.

—<u>Association.</u> Due to the state of the lawns and the risks of Covid, TCC did not host as has been customary the National Weekend Advanced or Midweek Handicap competitions. Teams played in modified versions of the CN and East Pennine Leagues, in the Mary Rose (defeated in Round Two), the Longman Cup and the Secretaries Shield (reaching the Quarter finals in both) Terry Vernazza won the Advanced Singles, Eric Nixon the Handicap Singles, Alan Thwaite and Terry the Handicap Doubles and Dave Okell the One Ball.
